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

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

Back home, I called the seller back, asking about the PL-41 again. One more journey and it was installed in my test system. You can see from the photo, it was a bit rough, but other than playing a bit slow, this relic from the 60s sounded much better than I expected.

Two quick tests revealed 32.9 and 33.1 r.p.m. respectively, and the arm dropped like a rock when set down on a record. Not good.

I had to lower it manually and very slowly to the down position so that the stylus would not bounce across the record. Obviously, a new belt and damping fluid were the first areas to address.

The workings of the PL-41 are easy to get at; you merely need to slide a few latches and pull the bottom cover open to access the mechanism.

Unscrewing a cap on the bottom of the spindle column revealed a fractured thrust plate. With the necessary parts ordered, further examination reveals the rest of the table to be in good order.

The fluid and thrust plate went in easily, but the platter was stubborn and actually required a rubber mallet blow to the spindle, while pulling up on the platter, to set it free. Not a grand-slam swing, mind you, but a bit more than a gentle tap. The capstan and the platter were cleaned again to make sure there was no crud between them and the belt. I crossed my fingers, installed the belt and powered it up. Two more tests indicated 33.31 and 33.33 – up to modern specs!

Now the table was moved off the bench and mated with the Marantz 2215B and a pair of Canton Karat 200s to create a proper vintage system. With the speed issues solved and better speakers, the little Pioneer really rocks.



The moral of the story?

Don't miss the forest for the trees. Sure, we all want to stumble onto that vintage pair of McIntosh MC30s or Marantz 2275 reciever at a garage sale for next to nothing. If you're vigilant, it just might happen.

But while you're waiting, don't overlook the interesting but unidentified piece. Sometimes that is just as satisfying. Even though this table started out looking like it had survived the big one, it didn't mean it couldn't still make music after a day at the spa.

If you are new to the vintage game, keep your eyes on the Audio Karma forum, it's a great resource for parts, repair information, and often some much needed motivation to finish your project!

Great sound for less than a G!

Pro-Ject MaiA DS2 \$999 project-audio.com

Pro-Ject Audio has a world-wide reputation for providing maximum value components that require a minimum of space. In the US, they tend to be better known for their turntables, but their modular set of DAC's, amplifiers, phono stages and such are almost like Legos. You can mix and match as the situation dictates, and they nearly always offer an upgraded, external power supply for more performance later. In this case, we are talking about the \$499 Power Box DS, which takes the DS2 to another level of performance entirely, and will power up to five more Pro-Ject components. We like this because it will eliminate all those unsightly bits hanging from your outlets. This also greatly diminishes the noise that said power supplies generate.

The MaiA DS2 is available in matte silver or black finish, and a variety of wood grained side panels, as illustrated below. This little power house only measures 9 1/2 inches square and is only a few inches tall. If you are space challenged, but don't want to sacrifice good sound, the DS2 is the perfect answer.

With 135 watts per channel on tap (via Class-D amplification) it can even drive a pair of Magnepan MMGs without trouble. For our listening tests, we used a pair of Paradigm Atom SEs, Bowers & Wilkins 607s and even a \$25k pair of Raidho D1.1s, along with a vintage pair of A/D/S 300is. All worked perfectly.

And if that's not enough, the DS2 is a great heaphone amplifier. Nearly all the headphones we used were worth the cost of the DS2, but again, the performance was fantastic.

As you can see, you can plug *everything* into the DS2. It even has an antenna for wireless streaming. Subwoofer and trigger capabilites are also a plus. We do suggest speaker cables terminated with banana plugs, as this is a densely packed rear panel.

The only thing lacking is the ability to decode MQA files and use the DS2 as a ROON endpoint.

But, you can't have everything for \$999, and now that Qobuz is here, the 24/192 DAC will definitely come in handy.

We made it a point to use a few modestly priced phono cartridges with excellent result, and the optical digital inputs are fantastic for breathing life into an aging CD player should you have one about.

Though the \$499 Power Box adds some bulk to the form factor, and prices the DS2 out of reach for our 995 column, it is a very worthwhile upgrade, especially if you end up adding a current hungry pair of speakers to your system.

For the price, the Pro-Ject MaiA DS2 is tough to beat, offinging sound, style, and function way beyond its meager price tag.

Anniversary Party: The Harbeth P3ESR Anniversary Edition

The current "40th Anniversary" P3ESR is an interesting little speaker. First and foremost, because it sounds good. It's not the "world's best" or "world's most loved" as the Harbeth website claims, because what is? It's also intriguing, because I remember sitting in Harbeth's Allen Shaw's listening room, listening to him tell me that little things like capacitors and wire don't matter and don't sound different. Yet here we are with an anniversary edition speaker utilizing upgraded binding posts, special Harbeth upgraded wire and premium capacitors inside. Hmmm.

All thumping on Mr. Shaw aside, these are fantastic little speakers, and thanks to a few tweaks are even better than they have ever been before. And they are an incredible value at \$2,890/pair. Should you share Mr. Shaw's view on premium components, save yourself a few bucks and buy a standard pair for about \$750 less.

Between you and me, get the 40th anniversary pair – they are far less boxy and cloudy sounding than the standard model.

A small speaker can only move so much air, and like every other small monitor, there's not much useable information below 70hz here. However, careful nearfield placement in a small room will migitate this considerably. True to their BBC heritage, the little Harbeths do an incredible job in the midband, reproducing voices and acoustic instruments in a lifelike manner. And for that matter, better than a lot of more expensive speakers.

Initial swaps between vintage LS3/5a, the current Graham Audio LS3/5a and the P3ESRs had me feeling the Harbeths a bit rolled off, but further comparison reveals that the Harbeth tweeter has slightly less horizontal dispersion, so they will just need to be optimized a bit more carefully when setting up.

If you think the Harbeths are wooly, you've them set up incorrectly.

Play with the rake angle a bit. A few degrees of tilt will change the perspective dramatically. To the better.

Once properly set up, the small Harbeths offer a sonic presentation that rivals my Quads in terms of soundstage dimension and midrange neutrality, though the ESLs get the edge in ultimate transparency and low level resolution. (as they should at nearly five times the price) Grooving on Paul Weller's lead vocal in the Style Council's "You're The Best Thing" is warm, deep and enticing, keeping Weller's voice locked in place, separate from the backing vocals and the instrumental play. Ditto for Japan's "Nightporter," and Shriekback's "Underwater Boys."

Bouncing through a long, totally 80s playlist of music that has normally been considered compressed and one dimensional, is a revelation through the small Harbeths. Duran Duran's "Reflex" fills the room, with layer upon layer of information, as does the Pogue's rendition of "Dirty Old Town." These tiny speakers have a big fun factor. Set up in my main listening room in a small, nearfield configuration, music without a ton of low frequency content is stunning and spacious. The level of tonal correctness and sheer amount of musical information that they do reveal is exceptional for the price.

Harbeth speakers have always been amplifier friendly, and the current P3 is no exception. As long as you have about 30 watts per channel on tap, you should be good.

More quality power on tap will offer more dynamic clarity with these speakers.

Running through a gamut of tube and solid-state amplification, the sheer resolving power of these speakers easily reveal the character of the wide range of amplifiers at my disposal.

Interestingly enough, my favorite amplifier with these speakers is the single-ended, solid state Sugden A21SE. This single ended class A design is a heavenly match for these speakers.

PrimaLuna's HP Integrated comes in a close second, and neither of these amplifiers will break the bank, should you want to build an entire system around them.





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Conclusions

Harbeth purists might find the thought of adding a subwoofer heresy, but why not? Again, desired effect. As we still had a pair of REL Carbon subs here, moving one into the big listening room, right in the center of the speakers works perfectly. REL suggests corporate maximum effect. but works perfectly. REL suggests corner loading for maximum effect, but the slightly diminished effect of being directly in the room makes mating

disappear in the room to begin with, giving them some seamless, low range grunt makes for a \$6,500 full range system that's tough to beat. Only when playing the loudest heavy rock at unreasonable levels do they show their limitations.

So, if you're looking for a great small pair of speakers that will unobtrusively coexist in a modest living room, the Harbeths certainly get my vote.

Exploring the Chord Qutest DAC

Perhaps it was fate that brought Rob Watts and John Franks together in 1994 at CES. Ironically, Rob Watts' parents had recently bought John Franks' childhood home and from this serendipitous conversation, a collaboration was born. Athough John Franks originally started Chord Electronics in 1989, it has grown significantly since Rob Watts joined the team, becoming a well-respected audio company based in the UK. Chord's Qutest DAC is just one of the award winning and innovative products that has resulted.

The Qutest makes a statement before the box is even unpacked. The thoughtful and unique packaging with its slick sleeve and nifty slide out drawer gives the Qutest a grand entrance. A 1.5m 5V 2a micro switching micro USB power supply (wall wart), a 2m A to B USB cable, an overview owner's manual and soft silk bag are included. But don't be fooled by its unassuming size and pricetag that won't make you break into a cold sweat when you hand over the credit card. Measuring only 41mm H x 160mm W x 72mm D (1.6" x 6.7" x 2.8") and weighing in at 770g (27 oz), the Qutest holds the potential for great sounding digital music in a stylish and solidly built desktop design.

Qutest sports two spherical, polycarbonate buttons and a circular glass window in the top panel. This window into the heart of the DAC illuminates to indicate the sample rate of the incoming data: red for 44.1kHz, through orange, yellow, lime, green, teal, blue, and purple as the sample rate increases to 768kHz and white for DSD data up to DSD 256. The Qutest does not support MQA files. The left button selects the filter and the right button is used to select the source. The maximum output level is fixed, but if the filter and source buttons are pressed simultaneously when the DAC is powered up, the level can be set to 3V, 2V, or 1V.

The magic of the Qutest is all about what's inside. In a world where off the shelf DAC chips are readily available, Chord is in rare territory, going the FPGA route. The Qutest is built with Chord's most innovative technology to date, utilizing the Xilinx Artix 7 chip and the XC7A15T processor right out of the Hugo 2 portable headphone amp. This has allowed the Qutest to be 30% faster and 50% more efficient than it's predecessor, the 2Qute. Huge, considering the 2Qute is an excellent DAC. The Watts Transient Aligned filters increased the tap length from 2Qute's 26,368 to a whopping 49,152 using a 10 element Pulse Array design. To put this in perspective, an 'off the shelf' standard chip may offer a couple hundred taps at best.

This truly customizable technology results in less electronic jitter or interference, satisfying Chord's premise that less jitter means a more natural analogue sound. The Qutest does not disappoint in this respect. Digital music can sound notoriously sterile and lack that warm analogue feel, however the Qutest handily eliminates that by softening the edge while keeping the sound crisp, clean and enjoyable.

Scrolling through the filters, the warm(orange) setting proves my favorite, but this will be a subject for experimentation with some listeners. Beware the urge to over process! Pink Floyd's "Us and Them" in DSD was the perfect way to begin listening in earnest, with major dynamics revealed.



I was surprised at the level of detail now in the mix with the guitar and sax now perkier than ever. There is no hint of a sharp digital edge or harshness. Buena Vista Social Club's "Chan Chan" in 96/24 FLAC convingly reveals the sincerity in Ibrahim Ferrer's voice, with the detailed percussion and guitar sound is separated, forward and full of warm Cuban spice.

Equally enticing is a 24/96 version of Mark Knopfler's "Redbud Tree." The smooth, layered sound that Knopfler is famous for excites, with an abundance of tonal saturation throughout. Redbook files proved equally involving, so those of you that haven't yet embraced high resolution digital files will not be disspaointed in the least. Regardless of files chosen, I find the Qutest on par with my vinyl front end; enough so I can easily relax and enjoy, without feeling that digital playback was taking a back seat.

The Qutest can be used with a computer, tablet, CD transport, network streamer, or wirelessly. And it is a ROON endpoint. This flexibility allows the listener to enjoy high resolution digital music from the most convenient source. One small drawback for consideration is the inability of the Qutest to render MQA files. For satisfying performance, versatility and great value in a relatively small DAC, the Outest is hard to beat.

Truly, this is a piece of equipment that can be enjoyed for hours and hours of great digital music listening. At \$1,895, it gives a serious helping of big bucks digital at an approachable price.

Tokyo Record Bar:

Recreating the experience at the World of McIntosh was to extend the experience and make it available to a larger audience that want to enjoy the unique offering of an ultimate audiophile den, as well as accommodate larger parties who would otherwise be restricted by the intimate space at the Tokyo Record Bar.

Can you discuss what this involves or must it be kept quiet?

I saw an MC275 and preamplifier, as well as a ProJect turntable, but what is the entire system?

The system consists of the following equipment:

- MC275 vacuum tube stereo amplifier
- C2600 tube pre amp
- MT5 precession turn table
- Sonus faber Sonetto V loud speakers
- Wired with McIntosh cables and interconnects

Is the Tokyo Record Bar all vinyl or are they doing some streaming too?

The Tokyo Record Bar is a vinyl-based experience, each patron selects one song from a vinyl menu that is integrated in the evening's experience. With this in mind, the system we installed works to surround a McIntosh MT5 turntable, but no streaming in-wall.

Is this something more that we can expect to see in the future, more like an extension of movie/tv show placement kind of thing, where people that are enjoying life do so with McIntosl group components in the background. i.e. we associate McIntosh with more luxurious pursuits, "making hifi cool again"

Great question. There certainly is a trend of bars investing in audio equipment to enhance their listening and musical experience for patrons. These establishments often equip themselves with nice HiFi audio products to elevate experiences musically and also visually. There is something to be said about guests engaging with hypnotizing blue meters in line with the music behind the bar, sort of like putting on a show. Investing in products also shows an establishment takes music seriously and wants their customers to enjoy the best music pairing and products possible.

Ultimately, a great audio experience for Tokyo Record Bar patrons and connect audiences with HiFi. We know guests go there for a special evening, so we want to make sure it sounds special too. Maybe they'll feel inspired and will invest in a special HiFi system for their own home.

Have you had any initial feedback, from either the restaurant, or have you seen things popping up on social media, etc.?

We launched the partnership with an exclusive premiere of the dining experience at the WOM Townhouse which generated some buzz on social media.
